- Attached to this newsletter is a Resident Complaint Form. Please use this form to submit any complaints pertaining to violations of the C.C. & Rs to Peggy Webb. Be very specific listing times and dates. We are a neighborhood,

and hopefully most minor problems can be resolved by communication between neighbors. But if you are uncomfortable confronting a neighbor for any reason, Peggy will be happy to help resolve the matter.

Please read or review the C.C. & R's. Guidelines are clearly defined, and knowledge of and adherence to these guidelines would eliminate most of the problems in our neighborhood. They were only designed to maintain the high quality of The Missions - something we all want. Please refresh your memories concerning restrictions of garage doors, parking, noise, storing of garbage containers, etc.

Also watch your speed through the neighborhood! We have lots of small children, and they aren't always as alert as they should be.

Architectural Committee
Steve Perkins:

- Please be sure to review the Architectural Guidelines before submitting plans to the Committee for approval. That would save a lot of time and allow homeowners to begin their landscaping as soon as possible.

Any exterior improvements to a house in The Missions at Ivey Ranch Homeowners Association must be approved by the Architectural Review Committee prior to the commencement of these improvements. This includes changing garage doors. You must submit plans which are in compliance with the Architectural Guidelines for style and color and receive approval before changing the doors.

Residents have six months from the close of escrow to have their front landscaping complete. It is the summer season, and weeds get a foothold quickly. Please monitor your unimproved areas - your neighbors don't want your weeds!

Thank you for your continued cooperation with your final landscaping plan sign-offs. This process ensures compliance with your original submitted plans. Eventually all properties will be signed off and in compliance.

The Architectural Control Committee meets the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of every month.

Community Liaison
Camille Mogavero:

- The Mormon Church owns the property on the northwest corner of Mesa Drive and Ivey Ranch Road, and had planned to build on that land soon. However, they have now decided to downsize their original plans and must re-submit all plans for approval. The revised completion date is now at least two more years from now.
- Park - the new park scheduled for development on the property east of King Jr. High (on Mesa Drive) is a 3 million dollar project which currently has run out of money. Apparently most of the funding comes from housing developers so the project is waiting for more new houses to be built in that area. Don't look for a new park for another 3 - 5 years.
- Martin Luther King Jr. Middle School is scheduled to open this fall (1994).



GOOD NEIGHBORS

El Camino High School

The HOA Board members recently met with school administrators from El Camino High School to discuss problems and solutions involving high school students and The Missions. Jerry Salyer, representing the HOA, had informed members of the Oceanside Unified School District (OUSD) of damage done to our property and trespassing and truancy by the students. Representing the school district were the principal and assistant principals of El Camino, a trustee from OUSD, and an Oceanside police officer assigned to El Camino. The HOA Board members were very impressed by the concern and willingness to cooperate of the school representatives. They informed us that they have increased security near our property, and encouraged the Missions Homeowners to call them to report trespassers. They offered to inform us about upcoming school events which may affect residents of the Missions with increased noise, lights, or activity.

If any homeowner sees high school students damaging or trespassing on The Missions property, please call Roger Olsen, assistant principal at El Camino (757-8550, ext. 436) or Officer Joseph Sepulveda of the Oceanside Police Dept. (966-4978). Identify yourself as a resident of The Missions at Ivey Ranch.

We would like to thank all of them for their attempts to be Good Neighbors.

Bruno's Italian Restaurant 2216 El Camino Real, Oceanside, phone 722-7771.

Bruno's recently opened their second restaurant in Oceanside, the other one is located at Restaurant Row in San Marcos. The food is home style, very good and very large portions. The prices are also very fair. One serving usually will feed two or certainly enough to take home for lunch!

They feature a daily buffet, Monday through Saturday, \$7.50, and a Salad Bar, \$5.25. they also feature a Sunday Buffet Brunch for \$11.95.

Bruno's pizzas are not only excellent - (The Olive Oil pizza is great) but very large. By large we mean 20 inches, for \$12.95!

The weekends are very crowded and quite noisy so either go early or late to enjoy a quiet dinner.

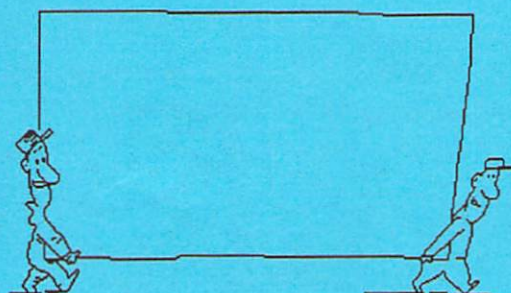

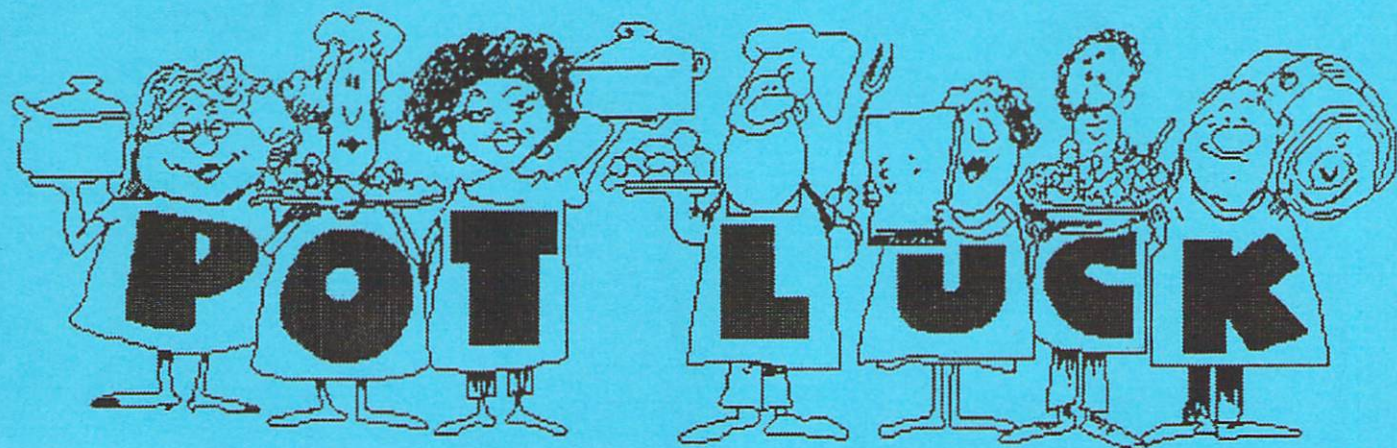
