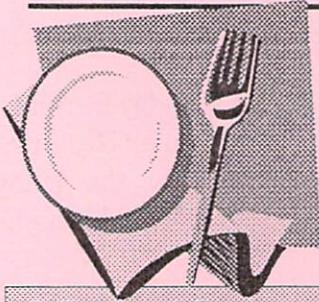

Restaurant Review



A Taste of Europe
1733 S. Coast Highway
Oceanside
722-7006

In trying to decide which local restaurant to select I am always surprised at the lack of really good choices available in Oceanside. The better restaurants seem to be in Carlsbad, Encinites, Del Mar, La Jolla and San Diego.

The recent arrival of the upscale, **A Taste of Europe** may be the vanguard of change toward fine dining in Oceanside. This restaurant occupies the site of what once was a pseudo Italian restaurant (of which there are many). The new owners have re-decorated and the result is

a comfortable, charming European style dining room.

The chef and co-owner, Josef Eberl is Austrian and the menu reflects his continental skill. Some of the many wonderfully prepared suggestions from the extensive dinner menu are: The excellent Herb-Crusted Lamb Medallions; Escalope of Pork a la Viennoise, a Viennese style thinly sliced breaded pork cutlet garnished with lemon and parsley; Escalope of Pork a la Griotte has a French touch finished with a cherry cream sauce; also Veal Forestiere, thinly sliced escalope of veal sautéed with a mushroom cream sauce; Roast Crown of Lamb, an herb-scented Rack of Lamb; Chicken Supreme, a boneless breast of chicken, stuffed with broccoli mousse; Fish du Jour.

On your first visit to A

Taste of Europe, I suggest the Gourmet Sampler, which consists of an herb scented lamb chop, filet mignon and shrimp scampi. All entrees include choice of salad or an unusually good soup. Potatoes or rice pilaf or spaetzle and a special vegetable accompany the entrees. The dessert tray is extra but worth considering. Dinner prices are moderate, starting at \$9.95. There is a special lower priced luncheon menu for mid-day dining.

Maureen, the co-owner and hostess is an alumnae of the prestigious Culinary Institute of America and it shows in the care and thought that has gone into this restaurant. This is the type of restaurant Oceanside needs. I think you will enjoy dining at **A Taste of Europe**. We did.

Cherry-Pretzel Delight

Here is an easy no-bake recipe in honor of George Washington's birthday (remember he was the guy that chopped down the cherry tree).

1 cup pretzel crumbs
1/2 cup sugar
1/4 cup soft butter
8 oz. container Cool Whip
1 3 oz. pkg. cream cheese
1/4 cup confectioners sugar
20 oz. can cherry pie filling

Mix pretzel crumbs, sugar, and butter well. pat into 9 inch square dish. Cream confectioners sugar and cream cheese. Fold into Cool Whip. Spread over pretzel crust. spread pi filling on top. Refrigerate overnight. Serves 9

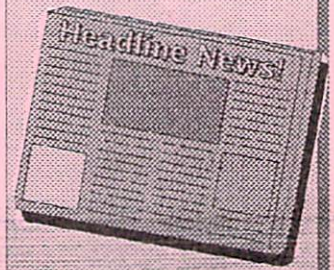
